The meeting was called to order at 7:00p.m. by Mr. Nyman with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment #1:

There was none.

Approval of Minutes and Bills Payable:

Approval of Minutes Payment of Unpaid Bills.

On motion by Mr. Nietupski, seconded by Mr. Volovnik, to approve the meeting minutes from the Board of Supervisors' May 23, 2023 Regular Meeting as presented. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

On motion by Mr. Volovnik, seconded by Mr. Nietupski, to approve payment of the Bills List dated June 20, 2023, for a total amount of \$191,617.53 as presented. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Board and Commission Reports:

Pennridge Regional Police Department: Chief Dickinson

The Chief shared the May 2023 Pennridge Regional Police activity report. The report is on file.

 There was general discussion about Old Bethlehem Pike road closure detour and visibility on Ridge Road at Tunnel Road and at Market Street. The detour at Tunnel Road is under review by the traffic planner. It was noted both locations are on a state owned road and located in Perkasie Borough. No formal action was taken by the Board.

On motion by Mr. Nietupski, seconded by Mr. Volovnik, to accept the Pennridge Regional Police Department report. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Pennridge Wastewater Treatment Authority: Dave Nyman

The March, April and May 2023 minutes and flow reports were provided to the Board.

On motion by Mr. Volovnik, seconded by Mr. Nietupski, to accept the Pennridge Wastewater Treatment Authority report. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Pennridge Area Coordinating Committee: Dave Nyman

The May 25, 2023 meeting notes were provided to the Board.

On motion by Mr. Nietupski, seconded by Mr. Volovnik, to accept the Pennridge Area Coordinating Committee report. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Township Manager's Report: Marianne Morano

Fee Waiver Request.

On motion by Mr. Nietupski, seconded by Mr. Volovnik, to authorize a \$40.00 electric residential building permit fee waiver for a new 100 amp service at 8235 Covered Bridge Road for Troop 55 Quakertown as presented. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Fuel Bids 2023-2024.

On motion by Volovnik, seconded by Nietupski, to award the unleaded regular 87 octane bid amount of 0.1890 market value to Riggins, Inc. and to award the ultra-low sulfur diesel bid amount of 0..3290 market value to Riggins, Inc. for the 2023 - 2024 fuel bids covering the bid period of August 1, 2023 to July 31, 2024 as presented. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

On motion by Mr. Nietupski, seconded by Mr. Volovnik, to approve the Township Manager report. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Public Works Report: Jeff Scholl

Mr. Scholl updated the Board on Public Works activities as of June 23, 2023. The report is on file. **On motion** by Mr. Volovnik, seconded by Mr. Nietupski, to approve the Township Public Works report. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Township Engineer Report: Steve Baluh, P.E.

Pennridge Airport Business Park Escrow Voucher.

On motion by Mr. Nietupski, seconded by Mr. Volovnik, to authorize escrow release Voucher 9 for Pennridge Airport Business Park in the amount of \$440.75 payable to Wynn Associates for construction observation as presented. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Stone Edge Culvert. Mr. Baluh reviewed base model design for the Stone Edge culvert which was designed and constructed to flood. If the rail road bridge was not there the culvert will still flood. Adding an 18'x6' concrete culvert and increase the height of Stone Edge Road four feet (4') would lessen the times the culvert is flooded but would continue to flood with 12" to 18" of

water during heavy rain events. Mr. Nietupski asked if emergency vehicles would be able to go over the culvert and Mr. Baluh stated that would need to be determined by the first responder if they would traverse a flooded culvert. It was noted the new development known as the McClennen Tract provided another means of access and egress to Old Bethlehem Pike which does not flood even during heavy rain events and this would be available in two years. Mr. Baluh estimated the cost of installing the proposed concrete culvert to be \$300,000.00 to \$500,000.00 which does not include review time and permit cost. Mr. Nietupski and Mr. Nyman were agreeable to proceeding. Mr. Volovnik questioned if raising the road would lessen the amount of water on the culvert. Mr. Baluh noted raising the culvert could cause additional flooding onto private property but he would review to determine the impact.

- Resident, 2122 Hill Road, asked if Hill Road bridge flooded. Public responded the Hill Road bridge was improved recently and does not flood.
- There was general discussion about Stone Edge culvert. Mr. Baluh will continue to refine projections. No action was taken by the Board.

On motion by Mr. Nietupski, seconded by Mr. Volovnik, to approve the Township Engineer report. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Township Solicitor Report: Will Oetinger, Esq.

Public Hearing Amendment to Chapter 1, Part 11. Public hearing was held as advertised to adopt Ordinance 301 to amend Chapter 1 Part 11, Administration and Government titled Municipal Claims; Interest and Attorneys' Fees to allow cost to be established by resolution instead of by Ordiannce. With no public comment the Public Hearing was closed.

On motion by Mr. Volovnik, seconded by Mr. Nietupski, to adopt **Ordinance 301** as presented. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

McClennen Tract Development Agreements. Development Agreements will be presented at the July 25, 2023 meeting for execution.

Draft Mandatory Public Water Connection Ordinance.

On motion by Mr. Volovnik, seconded by Mr. Nietupski, to authorize advertisement of a mandatory public water connection ordinance for properties on Old Bethlehem Pike as presented. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

On motion by Mr. Nietupski, seconded by Mr. Volovnik, to approve the Township Solicitor report. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

Department and Emergency Services Reports:

On motion by Mr. Volovnik, seconded by Mr. Nietupski, to acknowledge receipt of the Department and Emergency Services reports. With no additional discussion, all presented voted in favor.

New or Other Business Supervisors' Items:

There was none.

Public Comment #2:

- Larry Wheatley, 5 Boulder Drive, stated trucks are parked along the side of Hill Road.
- Tina O'Rourke, 1819 Old Bethlehem Pike, asked for the status of roundabout construction and road closure on Old Bethlehem Pike; Act 537 partial update to extend sewer on Old Bethlehem Pike; and seeking grants for the sewer extension. Original road closure was to be 6 weeks however utility poles need to be moved so Three Mile Run Road may be temporarily re-opened; letters to property owners regarding the Act 537 update with 30-day comment period are prepared and to be mailed; grant application will not be made until after 30-day comment period to determine property owners interest in public sewer connection.
- There was general discussion about the McClennen Tract. No action was taken by the Board.

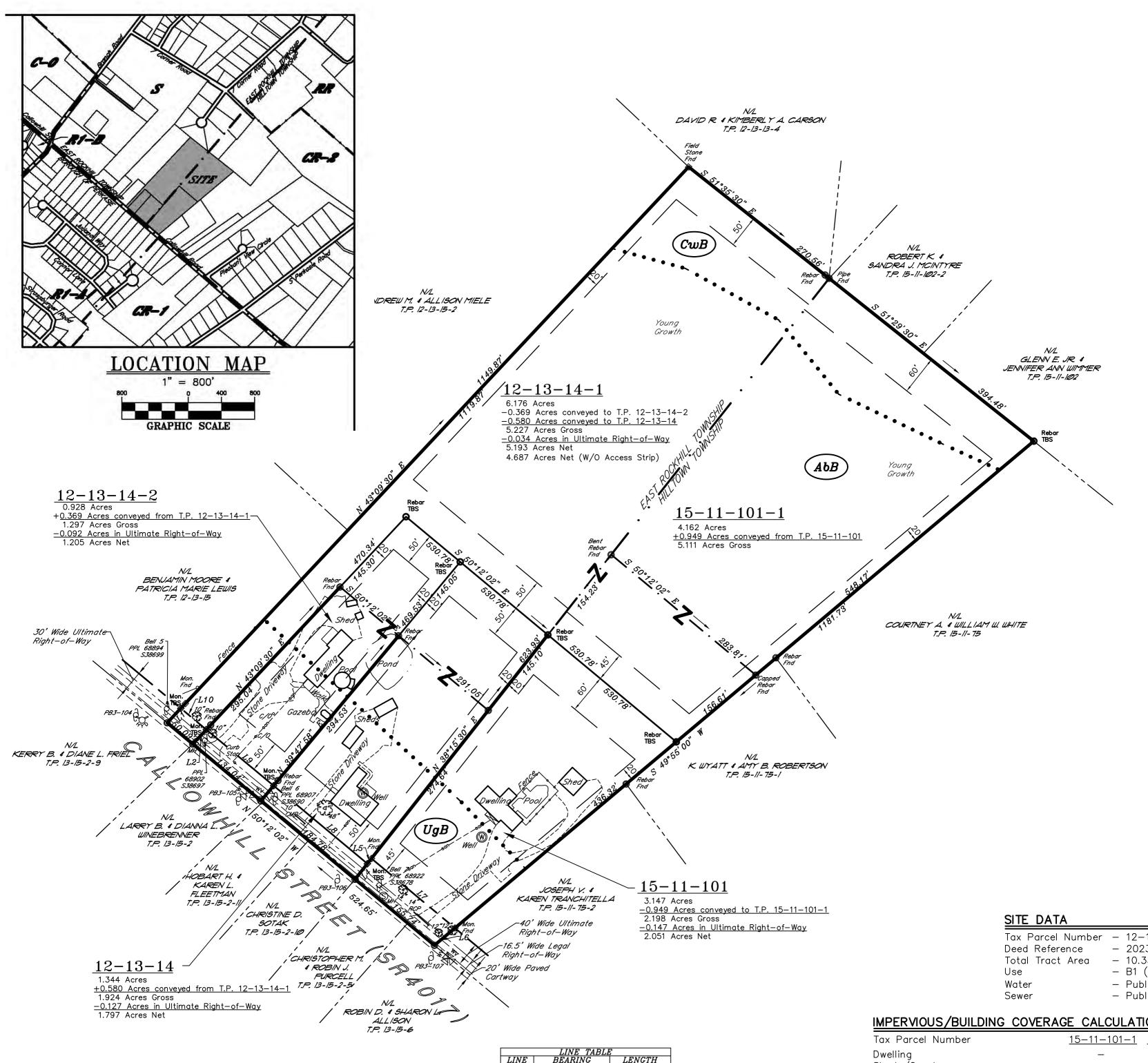

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FAST ROCKHILL TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. DRAFT

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF EAST **EAST ROCKHILL TOWNSHIP AMENDING** THE TOWNSHIP CODE OF ORDINANCES AT CHAPTER 26, WATER, BY CREATING A DISTRICT FOR MANDATORY CONNECTION TO PUBLIC WATER SERVICE TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE: **PROVIDING FOR MANDATORY** SAFETY AND CONNECTION **OF** CERTAIN **PROPERTIES** ABUTTING PROPOSED PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM EXTENSION; PROVIDING FOR REMEDIES FOR FAILURE TO CONNECT; AND REQUIRING WELL ABANDONMENT AT THE DIRECTION OF THE PENNSYNVANIA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

WHEREAS, East Rockhill Township has identified in the area described on Exhibit "A" hereto as having actual or potential perfluorochemical (PFC) contamination of the groundwater supply in excess of limits established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources, which presents a significant threat to the public health, safety and welfare of persons using water from private wells in such area; and

WHEREAS, the Second Class Township Code empowers East Rockhill Township to adopt an ordinance mandating public water connections (53 P.S. § 67603); and

WHEREAS, Perkasie Regional Authority is extending public water services to properties within the area identified on Exhibit "A" hereto; and

WHEREAS, Perkasie Regional Authority has obtained a grant to extend public water services to properties and into the homes within the area identified on Exhibit "A," and has projected no cost relating to the introduction of public water to these properties; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to §26-206 of the East Rockhill Township Code of Ordinances, and its general powers to protect the public health, safety, and welfare, the Township is empowered to require the properties within the area identified on Exhibit "A" hereto that abut the public water extension to connect to the public water system.

NOW THEREFORE, the Code of Ordinances of East Rockhill Township is hereby amended as follows:

ARTICLE I. <u>AMENDMENTS</u>

1. Chapter 26, Part 2, §26-201 is hereby amended so that the definition of "Water System" reflects "Perkasie Regional Authority" rather than "Perkasie Borough Water Authority" as the applicable water service provider referenced in Chapter 26, Part 2.

The revised definition of "Water System" shall read as follows with italicized language reflecting the revision:

<u>Water System</u>- All facilities, as of any particular time, for production, transmission, storage and distribution of water in the Township of East Rockhill owned, operated, and maintained by the *Perkasie Regional Authority* ("PRA").

- 2. Chapter 26, Part 2, shall be amended so that all references to the "Perkasie Borough Water Authority" or "PBA" are replaced with "Perkasie Regional Authority" or "PRA," respectively. The amendment shall be made in the following sections:
 - §26-202.1
 - §26-202.2
 - §26-203.1
 - §26-203.2
 - §26-203.3
 - §26-204

- §26-205.3
- §26-205.4
- \$26-206.1
- §26-206.2
- §26.206.3
- 3. Chapter 26, Part 2, §26-206.3 shall be amended to reflect that connection to public water shall be made within Ninety (90) days' notice, rather than the Sixty (60) days' notice currently provided. The revised §26-206.3 shall read as follows:
 - §26-206.3. If the owner of any improved property abutting upon the water system is directed by the Township, with PRA's approval, to connect to the water system due to a threat to public health, safety, and/or welfare, the Township, and/or the PRA with the Township's approval, after Ninety (90) days' notice and failure to connect, may construct such connection and collect from such owner the costs and expenses thereof in any manner permitted by law.
- 4. Chapter 26, Part 2, §204 shall be amended so that Exhibit "A" to Chapter 26 is modified to include a map of the areas which need to connect to the public water system, specifically, those properties which abut the PRA water system extension constructed and installed along Old Bethlehem Pike, Bethlehem Pike, and Tabor Road to provide public water to wells contaminated with PFOA and PFOS. Any Improved Property located within the area shown on the attached Exhibit "A" and abutting upon PRA's public water line extension along Old Bethlehem Pike, Bethlehem Pike, and Tabor Road is hereby required to connect to the public water system of PRA within Ninety (90) days after notification from the Township that the connection for such Improved Property to the water system is available.
- 5. This ordinance shall only be effective where the connection to the water line shall be no cost to the property Owners connecting to PRA's water system. After connection, all property Owners connected to PRA's water system shall pay PRA's water rates and

- charges, and comply with all of PRA's rules and regulations, in effect at the time of connection and as may thereafter be amended.
- 6. The private wells located on the properties connecting to PRA's water system shall be sealed and abandoned, at the property Owner's expense, at the direction of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection.

ARTICLE II. REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances, which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

ARTICLE III. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>.

If any sentence, clause, section, or part of this ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, sections or parts of this ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Board of Supervisors that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

ARTICLE IV. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u>

This ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after its adoption by the Board of Supervisors.
