You are receiving this email from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) because you have expressed interest in the Rock Hill Quarry in East Rockhill Township, Bucks County.

Mining and related activities remain under a cessation order. DEP has given the quarry operator approval to perform improvements/modifications to their Erosion & Sedimentation (E&S) Control measures, in accordance with their Abatement Plan submitted May 9, 2019. The improvements/modifications are specific to the Sediment Trap 1 area located in the southern portion of the permit. The improvements/modifications will provide additional collection capacity of any surface water drainage coming from this area and provide additional protection and prevention of contributions of sediment outside of the mining permit. With this work, you may see additional employees, vehicles, or other activity on site as the Sediment Trap 1 improvements/modifications are conducted.

Additional changes to the Rock Hill Quarry web page have also been made as part of the ongoing effort to convey information and updates in a manner that is easy to navigate and use. We hope you find these changes beneficial.
