Hello,

You are receiving this email from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) because you have expressed interest in the Rock Hill Quarry in East Rockhill Township, Bucks County.

As of November 25, 2019, mining and related activities remain under a cessation order.

On Friday, November 22, 2019, DEP received a request from R.E. Pierson requesting permission to remove a piece of equipment, known as a grapple, from the Rock Hill Quarry. According to Pierson, an employee will arrive with a Ford F-350 and 21-foot black trailer, along with a personal pickup truck. One truck will enter the site traveling at a maximum speed of 4 mph to reach a water truck already on the site to use to wet the roads and work area. Once that job has been completed, the second truck will enter the site, also traveling no more than 4 mph to the shop area where the grapple is located. The employee will use the small loader sitting next to the shop to pick up the grapple that sits across from the shop and place it on the trailer. The driver will chain down the grapple and return the loader where it was to not do any unnecessary traveling on site. Before leaving, they will use the water truck to wash off the grapple and truck of any debris that may be present and will wet the roads down a second time. The total expected time is no more than 4 hours.

This activity has been scheduled for Tuesday, November 26, 2019. A DEP inspector will be onsite for the duration of the activity.
