Hello,

You are receiving this email from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) because you have expressed interest in the Rock Hill Quarry in East Rockhill Township, Bucks County.

**As of June 3, 2020, mining and related activities remain under a cessation order.**

Since the last community update sent on April 17, 2020:

- [DEP offices](#) remain closed to prevent the further spread of COVID-19. Staff continue to work remotely, conducting inspections as needed to protect the health and safety of the residents of the Commonwealth, reviewing reports, and otherwise carrying out the mission and work of the Department.
- On May 29, 2020, Hanson submitted information requested by DEP in response to comments on the Qualitative Geologic Survey Report (QGSR). DEP is currently reviewing the submission; as per DEP's April 17, 2020 request, additional information is expected before June 30.
- On June 1, 2020, RE Pierson requested and received an additional 30 days to remove equipment from the site.
- As of June 3, 2020, the following Air Quality permits for this site have expired or are no longer valid:
  - Plan Approval 09-0241 (1,000 ton per hour crushing plant) – expired May 30; facility never constructed
  - GP13-09-0001 (asphalt plant) and GP9-09-0084 (3 diesel engines) – permits are inactive and no longer valid; facility never constructed
  - GP3-09-0157 (portable crusher) and GP9-09-0083 (4 diesel engines) – permits no longer valid; equipment removed from site
