The meeting was called to order at 7:02p.m. by Mr. Nyman with the Pledge of Allegiance.

- Executive session took place preceding tonight's meeting for potential litigation

## **Public Comment #1:**

- Mark Ezzo, 2904 Hill Road, asked about tree clearing and environmental concerns on the McClennen Tract located between Old Bethlehem Pike and Hill Road. Both items were considered during the development stage and are according to recorded Subdivision Plan and a Court Order. Mr. Ezzo requested a copy of the Court Order.
- Tina O'Rourke, 1819 Old Bethlehem Pike, asked if Old Bethlehem Pike sewer extension documentation was submitted to DEP and if that extension was approved will the Township commit to making a concerted effort to engage the community beyond the first-class letter already mailed. Yes, the submission was sent to DEP. Board consensus was to invite East Rockhill residents to a public meeting to answer questions they may have about the sewer extension once DEP approval has been granted.
- Lou DiTonno, 1 Bouder Drive, stated Stone Edge culvert flooded during the recent heavy rain event. Mr. Volovnik stated numerous locations throughout the Township flooded and yes the Township is aware. Mr. DiTonno, asked if the Township had met with the farmer adjacent to the culvert. Yes, and are waiting for them to respond.

The denial letter, Zoning Hearing Board application and supporting documentation were provided to the Board.

## **Public Works Report: Jeff Scholl**

Mr. Scholl updated the Board on Public Works activities as of December 14, 2023. Of note, the 2023 fall leaf collection has been completed and was the largest collection to date, flooding occurred during recent heavy rain events, but water receded quickly and the tractor repairs are anticipated to be completed within 30 days. The report is on file.

  through the McClennen Tract will be open to the public and did not feel the width of new
  road was adequate. Yes, the new road will be a public road but at this time is gated for
  security during construction, however Pennridge Regional Police Department have a key.
- Greg Landis, 606 Lawn Avenue, stated ReNew Church has submitted a lighting plan to the Township in response to a neighbor concern and the Church will be having a December 23, 2023 6:30p.m. service which will involve vehicle traffic and headlights.

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• Tina O'Rourke, 1819 Old Bethlehem Pike, asked for the status of the roundabout at Park Avenue and Three Mile Run Road. It is planned to be constructed in the Spring 2024.
