The regular business meeting of the East Rockhill Township Board of Supervisors was held at 7:00 PM on March 25, 2025, in the meeting room at the East Rockhill Township Municipal Office, 1622 North Ridge Road, Perkasie, PA 18944.

The meeting was called to order at 6:59 PM by Mr. Volovnik with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Members of the public and press were present.

Announcement:

- Executive Session to take place following the meeting for potential real estate acquisition.

Special Presentation:

<u>Conditional Use Public Hearing and Consideration of Waiver of Land Development.</u> Perkasie Regional Authority was present for a 8,712 SF water treatment building at an existing well site G1 Utilities Use at Blooming Glen Road (1100 Branch Road) tax map parcel 12-014-068. Mr. Sean Torpey, P.E.; Mr. Jakob Reilly, P.E.; Mr. Nick Fretz, Manager; Mr. David Watt, Chairperson and Mr. Tom Horn, Vice-Chairperson were present. The public hearing was opened. No party status requests were received. Mr. Sean Torpey and Mr. Nick Fretz were sworn in and provided testimony.

The stenographic record was paused and the hearing was opened to public comment.

- Claudia Malone, 66 Ridge Run Road, asked if renewable energy was considered. Solar has been considered but due to potential inconsistencies the grid with generator will be utilized.
- Chuck Weaver, 47 Ridge Run Road, asked if the removal of three parking spaces will be a problem if motorists park in front of the building driveway access. The area will be marked no parking or personnel trucks will drive on grass.
- Nick Lengetti, 2122 Hill Road, asked when the well was last tested and how many hours it would run. Six months and six hours.
- Jennifer Wright, 400 Three Mile Run Road, asked for testing results, the decommissioning of a well and project cost. Mr. Fretz responded 30 ppt arsenic, 1.8 ppt PFOA/PFOS and \$10 million.

The hearing was reopened to the stenographic record.

The stenographic record of the hearing was taken and will provide a record of the proceedings. A request can be made to Cooper Reporting 267-377-7435. Transcripts are stored for five years.

On motion by Mr. Nietupski, seconded by Mr. Nyman, to grant waiver of land development contingent on compliance with Wynn Associates correspondence dated March 12, 2025, waiver for the collection of an emergency service fee and waiver of financial security. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

On motion by Mr. Volovnik, seconded by Mr. Nyman, to grant Conditional Use approval contingent on compliance with Wynn Associates correspondence dated March 12, 2025, waiver for the collection of an emergency serve fee, wavier of financial security, compliance with well guarantees including the Harris Farm, architecture similar to Point Pleasant Pumping Station subject to Township approval and compliance with the Planning Commission March 13, 2025 meeting minute recommendations. With no additional discussion, all present voted in favor.

• Lou Ditonno, 1 Boulder Drive, asked where public water is tested before going into his house. The water authority tests at the entry point into the water system as required.

The Public Hearing was closed.

Executed adjudication will be the Official Decision of the Conditional Use Hearing.

INVITATION TO BID 2025 Hill Road Storm Sewer Improvements East Rockhill Township

Sealed bids will be received by East Rockhill Township electronically via the PennBid Program until 2:00 PM on April 21, 2025, for installation of 786 LF of 18" HDPE stormwater sewer along Hill Road including inlets, shoulder restoration and traffic control. Bids will be reviewed publicly and made available electronically at 2:00 PM on April 21, 2025. Specifications and forms for proposal may be obtained or examined on the internet at <u>www.pennbid.net</u> (or <u>www.ebidexchange.com</u>) at no cost. (Contractor must register in accordance with PennBid requirements). The successful bidder is required to pay fees established by PennBid equal to 1/3% of the awarded bid total.

Bids must be made on forms furnished by the Township (via PennBid) and must be accompanied by a certified check or bid bond, issued by a Surety licensed to conduct business in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the amount of at least (10%) of the total price bid made payable to the Township; and Anti-Collusion Affidavit. Contractor shall verify compliance with the Public Works Employment Verification Act (E-Verify Program). All information must be submitted via the PennBid Program.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish and pay for satisfactory payment and performance bonds in the amount of 100% of total bid award; and Insurance approved by the Township, in accordance with bid specifications.

Award of Contract, if a Contract is awarded, will be based on the Total Base Bid plus selected Alternate Bid item(s) at the sole discretion of the Township, and will be to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. East Rockhill Township reserves the unqualified right to reject any or all bids and waive any informalities.
